Professor Francisco is a tenured professor and chairman of the Department of PM&R at the University of Texas Health Science Center McGovern Medical School at Houston. Concurrently he is the chief medical officer at TIRR Memorial Hermann hospital, consistently ranked among the top three rehabilitation centers in the USA, and where he is the founding director of the NeuroRecovery Research Center. Prof. Francisco specializes in spasticity management, stroke rehabilitation and brain injury medicine. His current research includes rehabilitation robotics, spasticity management and neuromodulation.

He is a past president of the Association of Academic Physiatrists (AAP) and chair of the residency review committee of the Accreditation Council of Graduate Medical Education (ACGME). Currently he is a director of the American Board of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation (ABPMR), which certifies practitioners in the USA. Prior to assuming the role of editor-in-chief of this journal, Prof. Francisco chaired the ISPRM's education and publication committees.

Recent honors include induction to the prestigious National Academy of Medicine (2017), Sidney Licht Award from the ISPRM (2016), and Distinguished Member of the American Academy of PM&R (2015).
